## **Dennys Stuff**

Well Now! It's November 1st, and fall is here to stay. There are a lot of things going on in the Vollrath home now days. Starting off with the wedding between your editor and Ona May Brunsvold on November 7th, 2020. Due to the Covid 19 concerns, the wedding will be limited to family and a few close friends.

As for various projects in the pike, there isn't much new around here, your editor has covered most of the electronic projects that are related to the RC field over the past few years.

But, there is still a nagging issue that has raised concerns both in our RRCC club, along with RC members that follow the www.rcgroups.com web site.

Your editor has thousands of postings in RCGroups. One is my SwitchIR project. As a reminder, this project allows direct measuring of the resistance of the servo extensions and receiver switch harnesses.

The integrity of these servo extensions depends on the quality of the crimping job used by the manufacturer of these servo extensions. And, sad to day, a lot of the suppliers have very poor quality

control (Or no quality control) of their equipment.

In fact, one of the RC Modelers that has purchased one of my "SwitchIR" meters has found that 25% of his new servo extensions were junk.

And, out of those 25%, several were so bad that if the servo extension had been used on an elevator, it would have cost the modeler an airplane.

Add to that, the total lack of quality and design for some of those receiver switch harnesses that use a cheap sliding switch with four poles in parallel for turning the receiver on and off.

Your editor has found a number of those switches where the supplier only used ONE of the four poles in the switch. Your \$1000.00 30 cc gasser model is depending on a single sliding contact not smaller than the date on a dime.

I am out of parts for building more of those SwitchIR meters that has been covered many times in the RRCC newsletter. If around a half dozen more RRCC members would like to have one, I could place an order for parts to build more. My price of \$25.00 each for these units is the cost of materials.

It's easy to use, plug in the servo extension or receiver switch harness into the meter, and push its button. Any reading over 100 MilliOhms for a standard 12 inch servo extension is suspect.

Now, for those RRCC members that would like to build up their own servo extensions, I've been using a top quality crimping tool from Ebay. It is described as "Engineer PA-11" crimping tool. Not cheap at around \$80.00 or so.

But let me assure you that commercial duty crimping tools that were used at work years ago cost some ten times that \$80.00 each. And, the shop had hundreds of manual crimping tools. The shop also had several far more expensive automatic wire crimping machines.

The shop drawings called for the specific crimping tool, the wire size, and the specific terminal part number. If anyone got caught using the wrong crimping tool, wire size or terminal part number, it could cost them their job.

## **Dennys Stuff GPS Tracker**

One of our RRCC members brought in a GPS tracking device that can be installed into a model airplane. This device allows measuring maximum speed, average speed, maximum altitude, total distance and a few other things. Look for part number DYN4403 Passport GPS Speed Meter 2.0 in the Tower Hobbies web page.


I was intending on covering this device in the newsletter. It was ordered last


Wednesday, with delivery scheduled for last Friday. Roger N got his last Saturday.
